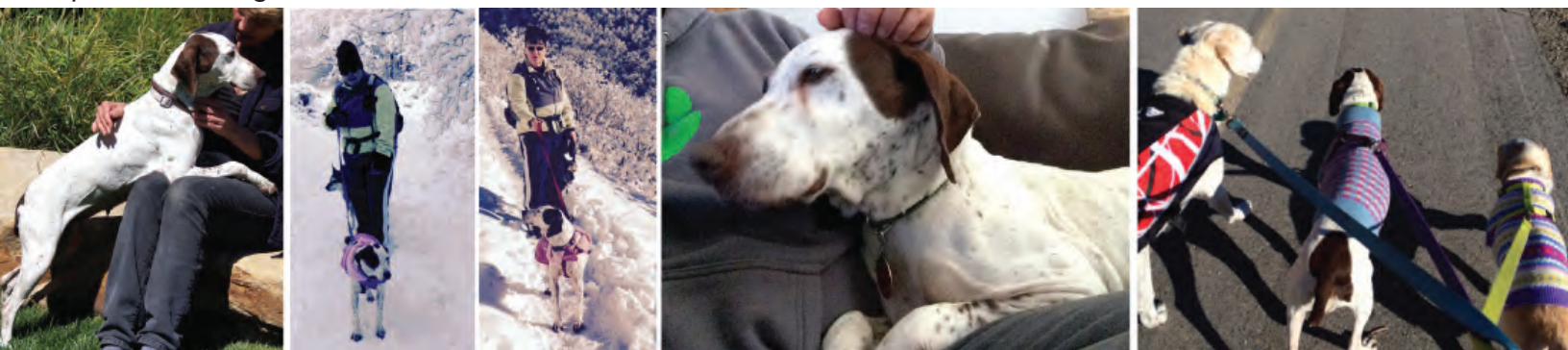

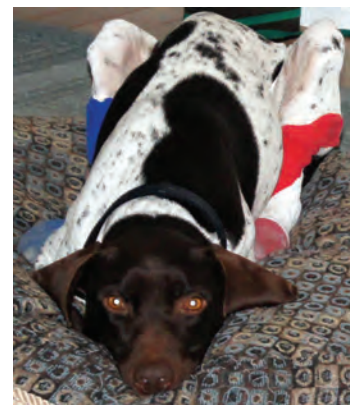

2014 In Memory

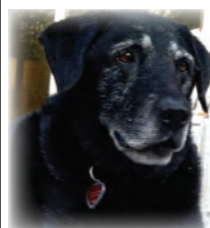
In honor of all our loving friends who left us in 2014 we're paying tribute to a few who touched our lives. All are precious. All are fondly remembered. None is forgotten.

Lacie was in our rescue for 1.5 years, coming to us at the ripe young age of 16. She was a not-so-benevolent dictator in Lynne's home and watched over 40 other fosters during her tenure.



Maria (mom) and Belle spent 12 wonderful years together in UT and the Phillipines. From her terrified beginnings at the Heber shelter she became a constant companion and dearly missed friend.

Max was Lynne's boy for 9 years. He was the most gracious host to all the fosters that trooped through his home. His quiet, gentle manner put them all at ease and made them feel comfortable.



Miko's mom is our dearly missed rescue friend from 7 years ago. Miko and Michele moved to the northeast. We miss you both. Rest gently, Miko.

Dear little old Ruby came to us from ID and was with us for less than a month, having suffered several strokes. She hung out in the Senior Lounge at Utah Dog Park and finally came to Marylin for her last days.



Ten-month old Lirya was a heartbreaker from SUVAS. She was the most beautiful pup with a broken neck from her days on the run. When Rob at Cottonwood's x-rays showed the seriousness of her condition we sadly euthanized our little girl. Her final home was with Marylin.

Statistics - 2014

There's always a lag time for our stats. Because we're so careful with our placements and want to make sure the family is completely comfortable with their new dog we require a trial adoption that can last anywhere from 8 days to a couple of weeks. Four of our dogs who went to their forever homes in December were formally adopted in 2015. Ninety-five dogs is a pretty typical number for us to have in a year. 32% of those were special needs.

2015 and Beyond

Every rescue person will tell you that their greatest hope is to become redundant. Utah's Perfect Pointers wishes for 2015 and beyond are:

1. to have all companion animals spayed and neutered so that every animal is a valued family member;
2. to have a home for every animal born and waiting homes to welcome the few who become displaced by death or natural disasters;
3. to have so few animals entering the shelters that their focus could change from triage to focus on training services, community support, and veterinary assistance;
4. to have adequate laws that can be enforced protecting the health and safety of all animals;
5. to have every person selling animals regulated by state and local agencies just like we are;
6. to have every person selling animals pay yearly fees to state and local agencies just like we do (think of the money that would raise for care of shelter animals!); and
7. to never have to say to a tired shelter worker, "I'm so sorry. We just don't have room."

Our little 9-month old Suri came to us in May, 2013. She and her 6 babies, 1 day old, had been dropped off at a shelter. They were the lucky ones with transport directly to us and a committed group of volunteers willing to take them in as soon as they finished nursing.

They were so big that their little momma was less and less interested in spending time with them, particularly when teeth started to appear. They were loved, cared for, socialized, vetted, trained for their age levels, and finally adopted.

So what happens to the other ones - the ones who have nowhere to go and no one to look out for them? In a civilized world this should never happen. But we all know that it does. And the answer is so easy.

Utah has the best support system I've seen in any state for low-cost veterinary care to stem the tide of pet overpopulation. We can end the suffering. We can end the overcrowding in shelters. The help is available.

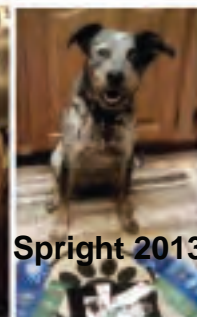
